

Medical curriculum information



Study Programme

Exchange is possible for advanced students in medicine (equivalent to Master cycle). They can participate in courses of the study-years 1st Master (4. Year) and to a selection of the 3rd Bachelor (3. Year). **Combinations** of the 3 year and the 1st Master are possible **only to a very limited** extent, due to conflicting time schedules. 2nd Year Master (5thYear) is the year of clinical electives, which are not organized centrally by the office of medical education.

Clinical clerkships (subinternships) are not the regular part of the Swiss European Mobility Programme of Zurich. They are only possible in exceptional cases, when they are an obligatory part of the study programme of the home University. A clinical clerkship in Zurich usually lasts at least one full month (from the first until the last working day) it requires about 40 - 50 hours of presence per week at the hospital ward. 6 ECTS credit



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points are allocated for 1 month of clinical rotation. Required Language Skills: C1 in most clinics, exceptions only on request.

Exams

Written exams take place at the end of each semester. For the students of the University of Zurich the passing of these exams is a prerequisite for the allocation of the credit points for the thematic block courses. Our written exams integrate clinical knowledge from different subjects (e.g. internal medicine, pathology, paediatrics' etc.) and are not discipline centred.
